

CWWA participates in the 7th Annual Pacific Water and Wastes Association Annual Conference

CWWA attended and participated in the Pacific Water and Wastes Association's (PWWA) 7th Annual Conference & Expo from the 9th – 11th September in Utulei, American Samoa. The Conference and Expo was hosted by the PWWA in partnership with the American Samoa Power Authority. The conference featured international and Pacific speakers, technical papers and workshops, which focused on the theme "Water and Energy in the Pacific". Approximately 150 delegates and exhibitors participated.

To coincide with the conference, additional meetings were held to discuss governance issues and requirements for the Association. In addition, a benchmarking workshop was carried out for Pacific Utility Members to discuss data collection for 2014.

Further collaboration through the Global Water Operators' Partnerships Alliance (GWOPA) will allow for PWWA's Chairman/CEO of Water Authority Fiji, Mr. Opetaia Ravai to participate in the Cari-WOP GWOPA/UN-Habitat Workshop to be conducted during CWWA's 23rd Annual Conference and Exhibition in Paradise Island, Bahamas.

PWWA is a regional association of organisations operating in the water and wastewater sectors whose mission is the delivery of quality water-related services that enhance the well-being of people throughout the Pacific region. The membership comprises Pacific Island water and wastewater utilities as well as international water authorities, private sector equipment and services supply companies, contractors and consultants.

The Secretariat is based in Samoa with full coverage across the utilities, regional schemes, consultancies, suppliers, associations, donors and professionals in the Pacific water industry.

The collaboration between organizations has fostered coordination between the Caribbean Development Bank and the Asian Development Bank, through the recognition that Small Islands Developing States around the world have the opportunity to share experience and expertise in the management of water and waste in their respective geographic regions.

WOPs are being promoted as a simple but effective method of bolstering the ability of public watsan service providers to play their full role in delivering quality basic services to all. The 1st Meeting of the Steering Committee of the Cari-WOP platform took place on 8 and 9 October 2013 during the 22nd CWWA Annual Conference and Exhibition in Barbados. The members of the SC prepared a work plan of activities for 2014 which include the organization of thematic training activities leading to the establishment of WOPs. Priority areas of capacity development support for the region are Water Safety Plans, Adaptation to Climate Change and Disaster Preparedness and Risk Reduction. A specific country activity was proposed for Haiti recognizing the importance to address the on-going cholera epidemic.

A Cari-WOP/GWOPA Session was organized as part of the Water Utilities Forum during the 22nd CWWA Annual Conference and Exhibition. In this session, examples of WOPs implemented in the Caribbean region were presented and a matchmaking activity was organized with water utilities who expressed their interest in becoming mentors or mentees with other water utilities in the region or outside the region.

The Memorandum of Understanding for the second phase of the Water Operators' Partnership between Belize Water Services (BWS) in Belize and Contra Costa Water District (CCWD) in the USA was signed and the activities are expected to start early 2014. This year, within the framework of the 23rd CWWA Conference and Exhibition, a workshop on "Risk Management and Natural Disasters – Best practices from Water Operators in Caribbean countries" is scheduled for 6 October 2014, at Atlantis Paradise Island Resorts, Paradise Island, The Bahamas. The workshop organizers are Cari-WOP, WOP-LAC and GWOPA/UN-Habitat.

UN CLIMATE SUMMIT



BAN KI-MOON FINAL SUMMARY



United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change

STATEMENT / 25. SEP, 2014

At the end of the Climate Summit in New York, UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon summarised the outcome. He told the assembled leaders:

This was a great day!

The purpose of the 2014 Climate Summit was to raise political momentum for a meaningful universal climate agreement in Paris in 2015 and to galvanize transformative action in all countries to reduce emissions and build resilience to the adverse impacts of climate change.

I asked leaders from government, business, finance and civil society to crystallize a global vision for low-carbon economic growth and to advance climate action on five fronts: cutting emissions; mobilizing money and markets; pricing carbon; strengthening resilience; and mobilizing new coalitions.

An unprecedented number of world leaders attended the Summit, including 100 Heads of State and Government. They were joined by more than 800 leaders from business, finance and civil society. This Summary details their most significant announcements.

Convergence on a Long-Term Vision

\$20M WASTE TO ENERGY DEAL SEALED ON CARIBBEAN'S NEVIS ISLAND

The government of Nevis Island, a small island in the Caribbean Sea, has signed off a deal that will see a waste to energy facility constructed on the island in partnership with Baltimore, Maryland based renewable energy firm, Omni-Alpha.

According to the Nevis Island Administration (NIA), the deal has been agreed between the company and the island's Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Energy and Natural Resources, as well as the island's electricity utility, the Nevis Electricity Company (NEVLEC).

The NIA said that the agreement was reached following several months of discussions and negotiations.

The partnership will also see the construction of a solar energy farm by Omni-Alpha to support the waste to energy plant and ensure the constant delivery of some 2250 MWh of power per year to the electricity grid on Nevis.

The total overall investment by Omni-Alpha is expected to be \$20M.

According to the administration the waste to energy plant will consume virtually all of the island's household and commercial waste, tyres, plastics, paper, plant and vegetable material and provide much needed ease on the island's sole solid waste disposal site at Long Point, Nevis.

The NIA explained that with constantly fluctuating oil prices and a population harassed by increasing electricity costs, it embarked on a programme of replacing fossil based energy generation with renewable energy sources.

As part of that program the island has already developed some geothermal generation capacity, and under the new partnership will now embark on adding waste to energy and solar capacity to the island's energy mix.


"This new partnership signals the further quantum leap forward of the island of Nevis, to become the example for the Caribbean and the world of a sustainable, green economy," said the NIA in a statement.

The NIA added that as part of the partnership Nevis will also immediately benefit from the provision of two brand new waste collection trucks.

Construction of the waste to energy plant and the solar energy farm is scheduled to commence in the final quarter of 2014 and to come online within 12 months.

The administration said that it hoped the approach will lead to substantial environmental and economic benefits to the people of Nevis as the island.
