❖ CORPORATE COMPANY

National, regional and international "COMPANIES' working in the field of water supply, wastewater or solid waste disposal, such as consultants, contractors, manufacturers or plant and equipment. Membership is also accepted from international companies operating in the sectors.

❖ CORPORATE UTILITY

National or regional 'UTILITIES' operating in the field of water supply, wastewater or solid waste disposal and providing services as a public or private sector utility.
