
WEBINARS

NATURE-BASED SOLUTIONS FOR WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT: A REGIONAL APPROACH

The CWWA WWSG hosted a webinar on April 25th 2024, on nature-based solutions for wastewater management within the region with approximately 100 registered participants. Some presentations included the Tobago Services Division of WASA-T&T, UN Habitat and the Martinique Water Office on constructed wetlands, lagoon systems and waste stabilization ponds within their territories.


