Technical Tour

These tours provide an immersive educational experience, allowing participants to explore the infrastructure of the Belize Water Services water treatment plant and Belize's vibrant natural ecosystems.

Delegates will have the option to visit a modern water treatment facility, where they will observe the innovative processes used to ensure clean and safe potable water. Experts will provide indepth explanations on the desalination process. This tour is ideal for professionals seeking to enhance their knowledge of water management solutions, particularly in the context of climate resilience and resource efficiency.

Technical Tour

Alternatively, attendees can choose to explore one of Belize's most treasured marine sanctuaries, Hol Chan Marine Reserve. Its thriving ecosystem supports over 220 marine species, including schools of fish, sea turtles, rays, and nurse sharks.

The reserve is particularly renowned for its remarkable coral formations, such as brain coral, boulder coral, and Staghorn coral, which create essential habitats for countless marine organisms. These intricate reef structures serve as both a refuge and a breeding ground for a vast array of invertebrates and fish, playing a crucial role in maintaining the region's ecological balance.

Both technical tour options promise to be enriching experiences, offering attendees a deeper appreciation of the vital intersection between industry, sustainability, and environmental stewardship. Whether exploring cutting-edge water treatment technology or diving into the extraordinary marine biodiversity of Hol Chan, delegates will gain valuable knowledge and inspiration to bring back to their respective fields.
